Curriculum

At Broadland we aim to provide a curriculum personalised to the needs and interests of all our students, enabling them to fulfil their potential and inspiring them to further study and lifelong learning.

We believe that the curriculum, both within taught lessons and beyond them, should create an environment where questioning, academic risk-taking and the freedom to learn from mistakes are all encouraged.

We intend that our curriculum should imbue in our students these qualities: responsibility, independence and a sense that learning can be exciting and valuable throughout life.

We follow the National Curriculum, as we believe it provides a broad, rigorous education for all children. We are proud of the wide range of educational visits and extra-curricular activities which support and extend the taught curriculum, including residential visits to France, Spain, Italy, China, Tanzania (and Derbyshire).

Our curriculum is designed to support students in systematically building their knowledge and skills and to remember what they learn.

Students choose Key Stage 4 (KS4) options during Year 9, which they begin at the start of Year 10. In addition to the traditional subjects students will have studied at Key Stage 3 (KS3), the current option choices include subjects as diverse as psychology, hospitality and catering and creative iMedia.



Study

Study is an integral part of learning at Broadland beyond teaching and learning in classrooms during the school day. We expect our students to study each day at home as it builds good study habits, supports their ongoing learning and personal development. Study at Broadland comprises of three separate elements:

1. **Personal reading** – the benefits of reading are extensive. All students have access to a wide variety of fiction and non fiction texts to borrow, at a variety of different levels from our library,
2. **Tasks and activities** – these are wide ranging and vastly different, depending upon the subject they are designed for. They allow our students to practise key skills or apply knowledge, as well as challenging and extending learning further,
3. **Retrieval practice** – is about revisiting material and memorisation. For our students to become successful learners, who know more and can do more, this is essential.

All students are supported and guided with study during lesson time and are provided with a student planner which includes a study plan. We also run a daily study club for those who would like further support or time to study at the end of the school day.





Pastoral

We are a small and inclusive academy with very high expectations of support for all of our students. We expect our students to work hard and their excellent behaviour is underpinned by the positive relationships between students and staff. Our staff care about our students and ensure they are supported, emotionally and socially as well as academically.

The safeguarding and wellbeing of our students is paramount. Our pastoral support begins during transition, when we visit the primary schools and when we welcome students to join us for a range of transition events. Our students continue to be supported throughout their time with us through their Tutor and Head of Year.

In addition to our highly qualified and dedicated safeguarding and inclusion team we also have a trained team of Student Safeguarding Ambassadors (SSA). Their role is to offer support and guidance to students from across the academy to promote positive actions in order to improve the safeguarding and wellbeing of all students.

Our student voice team is a very important group at Broadland as they represent our students views and needs. Each year group (Year 7 to Year 11) select two representatives for the academic year to represent them on the student voice team.

Enrichment

The memories that students take away from Broadland are not only those of academic success and friendship but also the lifelong learning experiences that they will remember and cherish forever. Students at the academy experience a vast range of opportunities to engage with local, regional, national and international events and activities. We work with a wide variety of partners in order to offer students the chance to work with local charities, businesses and education providers.

Our vision for enrichment at Broadland mirrors our Trust's vision. We aim to enrich the lives of our pupils, to broaden their horizons, raise aspirations, develop their social, emotional and life skills and encourage a love of learning.

Our broad range of enrichment opportunities plays an essential part in challenging our students to step outside their comfort zone, to push themselves physically and mentally in order to grow and develop their self-confidence, social skills, self-esteem and leadership skills. We offer the bronze and silver Duke of Edinburgh award schemes to all students.

An extensive extracurricular programme of clubs and societies, sporting fixtures, expressive arts, trips and residential visits, provides students in all year groups with experiences that bring learning to life. Our journey to achieving Eco-School status provides our students with opportunities to carry out a range of social action projects.





Careers Education, Information Advice and Guidance

Identifying your career goals can be a powerful motivator. As our students move through the academy they follow a programme of careers information, advice and guidance which helps them to understand the different options open to them, and also to understand where their own interests and skills lie. This is delivered through assemblies, PSHE lessons and tutor time. There are regular presentations from employers and colleges to help students understand the wealth of opportunities available.

Year 9 students make their options choices in the spring term. As part of this process all students discuss their future plans with a member of the senior leadership team, and students who need to can also access a full careers interview with a qualified adviser. Year 10 students participate in a large careers fair and undertake work experience in the summer term, before being supported in making their post-16 applications in the autumn of Year 11.

We expect all our students to be responsible citizens both in our academy and in the wider local community. We have high expectations for every student, actively promoting positive praise and relationships and celebrating and recognising students that meet these values. We place our students at the very heart of all that we do and actively encourage them to be involved in the future of Broadland High Ormiston Academy. Our student voice representatives play an active role in the future direction of our school and regularly meet with the Principal and senior and middle leaders to agree shared priorities, projects and fundraising events. A range of student leadership opportunities, that includes prefects, safeguarding ambassadors and sports leaders, enables students to contribute positively to the life of our academy.

Excellence

We want every student to aspire to achieve excellence in all that they do. Our academy consistently performs above national averages in both attainment and progress at the end of Key Stage 4. This success is driven through our unwavering focus on high quality teaching and learning in every lesson, every day for every student.
