Principal's Update

It has been a slightly odd week for me as I have spent the week at home off my feet recovering from tearing my achilles tendon. I'm looking forward to returning next week, but students may not see me out and about as much as normal whilst I continue to recover and work on my agility with the crutches!

This week, one of our students was involved in an accident with a car on the crossing at the bottom of Tunstead Road. The student was not at fault but it serves as a reminder of how important it is to ensure we are vigilant around the roads. I would like to thank those students that assisted immediately and gave statements as well as Mrs Middleditch, Mr Edwards and Miss King for their response. The student is recovering and looking forward to returning, and we wish them the very best with their recovery.

As mentioned in last week's parent bulletin, I would like to thank you for your support as we have revisited our uniform expectations. There has been a noticeable difference to student uniform, and we will continue to ensure that we communicate with you, in most cases via Edulink, where this is not the case.

A smart uniform is one of the key things that unites the school and draws us closer together as the Broadland High community. We want all of our students to be proud representatives of the Broadland High community at all times.

In order to ensure that our uniform looks smart, but also that our students can work consistently hard throughout the day regardless of temperature, you will be aware throughout June and July, it is not compulsory for students to wear their blazers. Over the course of this academic year, we have discussed smart shorts as an additional item of uniform with students with the intention of introducing this from the next academic year. However, on reflection, we would like to give students the opportunity should they wish to wear smart and appropriate tailored shorts during this summer term.

Details regarding the shorts that will be acceptable are below. Please note that all other aspects of the uniform should be worn properly alongside shorts. Ties should be worn unless directed otherwise, socks should be a dark colour with no logo, shirts should be tucked in, no outdoor clothing/ jackets should be worn in the building and expectations regarding footwear remain the same.

Shorts must follow the guidelines below:

Knee-length tailored smart shorts in black

Any belt worn must pass through loops and be plain black

No cargo style shorts

No logos or visible branding

No cycling shorts, sports/ PE shorts or short/ tight shorts are to be worn

The school will continue its relationship with Birds of Dereham who will supply badged and non-badged school uniform that is fully compliant with our uniform expectations, and a link to their non-badged shorts can be found [here](#). 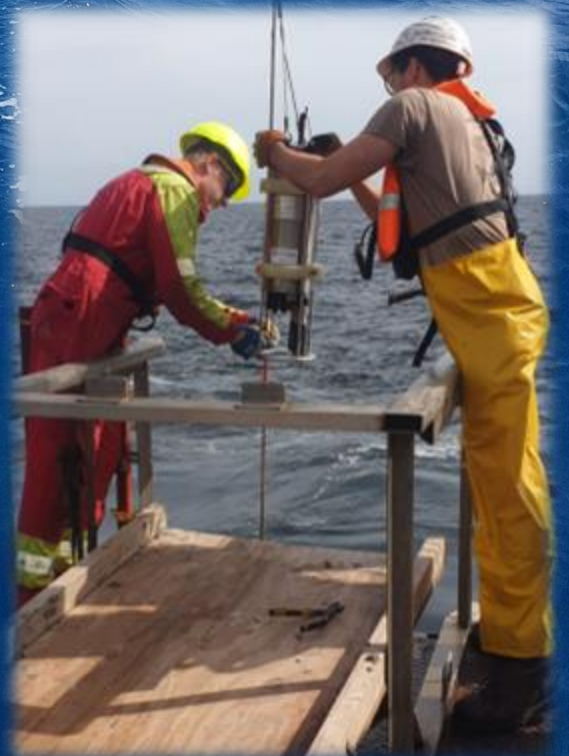

Is your child keen to get a part time job? Maybe they already deliver newspapers, have a Saturday job, volunteer at a charity shop or work during the school holidays?

Did you know?

It is illegal to employ children of compulsory school age without a **child work permit**. Without one the employer risks prosecution, and children may not be insured.

Attendance

Mobile Phones

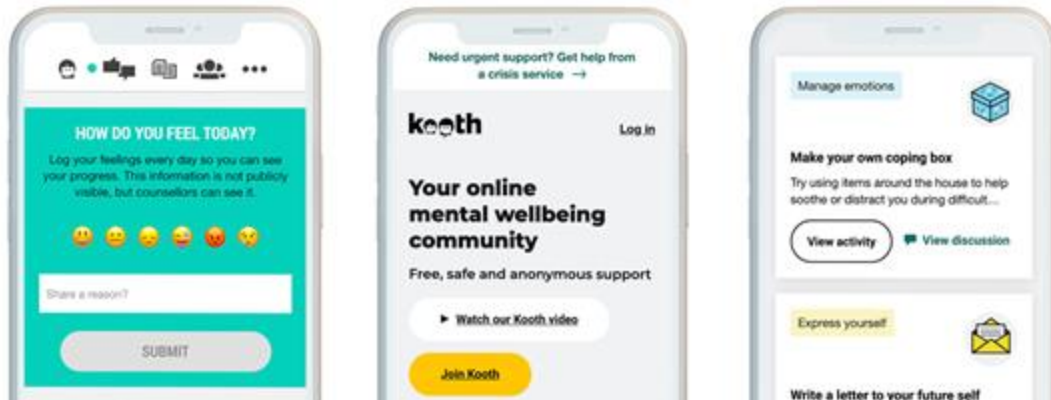

Kooth is a web based confidential support service available to young people. Kooth provides a safe and secure means of accessing mental health and wellbeing support designed specifically for young people.

Kooth offers young people the opportunity to have a text-based conversation with a qualified counsellor. Counsellors are available from 12noon to 10pm on weekdays and 6pm to 10 pm at weekends, every day of the year on a drop-in basis. Young people can access regular booked online counselling sessions as needed. Outside counselling hours' young people can message our team and get support within 24 hours.

When students register with **Kooth** they will have support available to them now and in the future. Support can be gained not only through counselling but articles, forums and discussion boards. All content is age appropriate, clinically approved and fully moderated.

Parents and carers have access to information on the popular social media platforms used by their children and their friends. They are also provided with an insight on critical issues such as bullying, sexting and gaming and are given easy to follow advice on how they can make their homes and the devices they give their children safer.
