Norwich Theatre's Boys Movement Company is a bold and diverse in-house company, exploring the wide-ranging styles of dance, choreography and movement from around the world. We are creating an inclusive place for boys with the aim of building confidence, resilience and friendships. What makes this company different to others is getting access to the world-class performers who visit and perform at Norwich Theatre - we are planning masterclass sessions with renowned movement companies as well as in-house workshops, invitations to film screenings, talks and tickets to watch productions. No previous experience is required.

Next week they are holding a Panto masterclass.


OAT French Spelling Bee Final.



Key Stage 4 Forms




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Accessing School Accounts From Home

How to access Teams, Office 365 and Outlook from home:

- 1. Go to the Broadland website.
- 2. Click the RM Unify button at the top of the page.



3. Sign in using student username and password:

Username: 23 followed by first letter of first name, then last name (Example: 23aking)

Password: The same password students use to log onto the computers at school



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Click sign in and it will load up the Broadland RM Unify

launch pad where you will find Teams, Outlook and Office 365.

 To log into Outlook, use the same details used for logging into RM Unify. It may ask for your email address which is, your username followed by @broadlandhighoa.co.uk (Example: 23aking@broadlandhighoa.co.uk)



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Kooth



Kooth is a web based confidential support service available to young people. Kooth provides a safe and secure means of accessing mental health and wellbeing support designed specifically for young people.

Kooth offers young people the opportunity to have a text-based conversation with a qualified counsellor. Counsellors are available from 12noon to 10pm on weekdays and 6pm to 10pm at weekends, every day of the year on a drop-in basis. Young people can access regular booked online counselling sessions as needed. Outside counselling hours' young people can message our team and get support within 24 hours.

When students register with **Kooth** they will have support available to them now and in the future. Support can be gained not only through counselling but articles, forums and discussion boards. All content is age appropriate, clinically approved and fully moderated.
