

Study: Subject Overview 2024/25

KS3

Subject	Details	Frequency
English	All students will be given a study booklet to accompany the unit being studied in class. Every two weeks, the class teacher will specify which tasks from the study booklet need to be completed.	Fortnightly
Maths	Each week students will be set a task from the MyMaths website. A minimum mark is expected, and students should watch any help videos and then re-try the task if needed. Students in Year 7 will also be expected to complete 10 minutes practice on the Times Table Rockstars website.	Weekly
Science	All students will be provided with knowledge organisers to support study with each topic. Each topic will take students 6-8 lessons. Students should produce a small set of flashcards to summarise content for each topic. Roughly 1 card per lesson. Each card should take 10-15 mins to complete. Students should start this process once they start a new topic so they should be working on science revision each week.	Weekly
History	Week 1: a specific task to complete from knowledge organiser booklet Week 2: revision-based practice to learn the core information for the unit (from the knowledge organiser).	Weekly
Geography	Students set a detailed study task once a fortnight. This will take the form of a revision task to be completed either using Knowledge organisers, BBC Bitesize booklets or Seneca Learning.	
REP	Key words & spelling tests set by class teacher.	Weekly/ Fortnightly
Modern Foreign Languages (MFL)	Students are set weekly study tasks, which includes vocabulary learning from their knowledge organiser. Students are also set a half-termly extended study task based on the topic they are studying.	Weekly/half-termly
Computing	Students will be issued with an online study booklet on Teams. This will contain all the study for year broken down into individual units. It is expected that students	Half termly

	will complete each unit of the booklet by dates which will be assigned by the class teacher.	
Art, Textiles and 3D	<p>Students will receive study tasks at key points throughout the year. They will have at least 2 weeks to complete these. Our study tasks are usually research based or skills practice.</p> <p>Because study tasks are less frequently set in these subjects, we encourage students who practice art at home to please show us what you're creating. We love to see it!</p>	Termly
Music and Drama	<p>Drama – Students are issued a study booklet at the start of the year. This contains knowledge organisers for each unit so students can carry out pre-reading and revision fortnightly and log in their planner. Study quizzes are set at the end of each unit on Teams.</p> <p>Music – Students will learn about a different topic each half term. Topics will include either a research task or a quiz to be completed on Teams.</p>	Half termly
Catering	Catering - Students are issued a study booklet at the start of the year. This contains knowledge organisers for each unit so students can carry out pre-reading and revision fortnightly and log in their planner. Study quizzes are set at the end of each unit on Teams.

Subject	Details	Frequency
English	All students will be given a study booklet to accompany the unit being studied in class. Each week, the class teacher will specify which tasks from the study booklet need to be completed, alternating Language and Literature. Where classes are split, Language and Literature study will be set by the individual teachers fortnightly.	Weekly
Maths	Each week Students will be set a task from the MathsWatch website. A minimum mark is expected, and students should watch any help videos and then re-try the task if needed.	Weekly

Science	All students will be provided with knowledge organisers to support study with each topic. Each topic will take students 6-8 lessons. Students should produce a small set of flashcards to summarise content for each topic. Roughly 1 card per lesson. Each card should take 10-15 mins to complete. Students should start this process once they start a new topic so they should be working on science revision each week.	Weekly
History	Revision-based practice to learn the core information from the unit, or previous units. Exam question practice will also be encouraged. Frequency may be altered at the teacher's discretion to respond to the needs of the class.	Fortnightly
Geography	The focus is revision. Students will complete various tasks in their geography study books or by completing a BBC Bitesize booklet or a Seneca task. A record of study tasks completed will be completed at the front of their study books to inform both teachers and parents of study progress.	Weekly
REP	Seneca assignment (around 20-35 minutes) based on the core information of the course.	Weekly (sometimes adjusted around assessment windows)
Modern Foreign Languages (MFL)	Students are set weekly study tasks which includes vocabulary learning from Quizlet.	Weekly
Computing	In Y10, students will be given occasional programming tasks to complete but the majority of study time should be spent using their exercise book and revision guide to learn the content covered in lessons, especially elements they need to revise from quizzes. Lesson slides in Teams can also support with this. In Y11, students should use the SmartRevise.online website for their independent study.	Weekly

iMedia	Students will be given study tasks based on the content from the lesson. The frequency of these will vary depending on when students are doing controlled assessments.	Weekly
Psychology	Slide shows will be uploaded regularly to Teams. Students will also be given a knowledge organiser for each unit. Homework will be based on learning factual knowledge, applying their knowledge to scenarios (in exam-style questions) or evaluating theories. Homework will be assessed in lessons through low stakes tests or sampling.	Weekly
Art, Textiles and 3D and photography	Students should work for a minimum of 1-2 hours on their projects. Art, Textiles and 3D and photography are all coursework-based subjects and keeping on top of sketchbooks/projects is extremely important. Sometimes specific homework tasks are set and if not, independent developments and catching up on unfinished work will be necessary.	Weekly
Music	Students will be given weekly homework tasks to complete on Teams. They will also need to compose two pieces of music and perform two pieces of music. Preparation for these will be done both in school and at home.	Weekly
Drama	Students will be given a study booklet at the start of the year. Students will watch a short video using the slides on Teams and answer the exam style question in their orange books – books handed in every Week 2 Friday	Fortnightly
Catering	Year 10 students will be expected to complete Level 2 Food Safety and log in for the website will be issued at the start of Year 10. Regular revision will be necessary for year 11 and low stakes will take place. Knowledge organisers will be issued for both Unit 1 & Unit 2 work.	Regular revision expected
Physical Education (PE)	Students expected to revise little and often. Homework will be mainly tasks on Teams or Seneca to measure understanding of key terms and concepts alongside revision for completion of these tasks. Other small tasks e.g. exam	Fortnightly (sometimes adjusted around assessment windows)
