Maths	Each week students will be set a task from the MyMaths website. A minimum mark is expected, and students should watch any help videos and then re-try the task if needed. Students in Year 7 will also be expected to complete 10 minutes practice on the Times Table Rockstars website.	Weekly
Science	All students will be provided with knowledge organisers to support study with each topic. Each topic will take students 6-8 lessons. Students should produce a small set of flashcards to summarise content for each topic. Roughly 1 card per lesson. Each card should take 10-15 mins to complete.
