## Young Carers

At Broadland High Ormiston Academy (BHOA) we believe all young people have a right to an education, regardless of their situation at home. When a young person has a caring responsibility, they may need extra support to help them get the most out of school. We define a Young Carer as a young person who has caring responsibilities for a family member with a disability, health condition, mental health condition or substance misuse issue, or who are frail and elderly. Young Carers may provide physical care, personal care, help with medication or practical tasks, or provide emotional support.

We are an informal group who meet in form time, the last Friday of each month, the students are provided with a hot meal, activities and a safe space to discuss any issues they may have with our young carer lead, Mrs Harvey.
